The library offers a wide variety of programs, including storytimes, book clubs, computer classes, special children's events, and more. We had 272 programs last year alone!



METROSHARE LIBRARY CARDS

If you live in Burleson, Forest Hill, Haltom City, Keller, Richland Hills, or Watauga, we accept your library card! There are a few collections we limit to Benbrook cardholders, but patrons can place holds, log on to the computers, and pick up their holds at our library.

DO YOU HAVE YOUR LIBRARY CARD?

THERE ARE MANY BENEFITS TO **HAVING YOUR LIBRARY CARD**

BENBROOK RESIDENT CARD

In order to sign up for a resident card, patrons must present a valid stateissued ID with a Benbrook address on it and a piece of recent, first class mail with the same address.

BENBROOK NON-RESIDENT CARD

To get a non-resident library card, you must have a valid state-issued ID and a piece of mail with the same address on it. Those who live in the service area of one of our partner libraries or in Fort Worth are ineligible.

TEXSHARE CARD

If you are a resident of Fort Worth and have a library card with Fort Worth Public Library, you may obtain a TexShare card from Fort Worth. Then, you may bring that TexShare card, along with a valid state-issued ID and a piece of mail with the same address on it, to our library to obtain one of our cards.

Certain collections, including digital content, are unavailable to TexShare patrons.

BENBROOK BUSINESS CARD

A business card grants access to all of our databases and online resources. To obtain one, a patron must provide documented proof of operating or being employed by a local business and be ineligible for a resident or non-resident card.

We are proud to offer a circulating collection of eReaders. Our Nook Glowlight readers are pre-loaded with content, including current best sellers. Our Kindle readers come without content and are intended to be loaded with library eBooks through Overdrive.

The Library of Things is a collection of kits that facilitate a variety of educational, recreational, and practical activities. Kits in the collection include musical instruments, a telescope, video games, a projector, knitting supplies, and more. Most kits contain books and other materials that provide instruction and guidance on the activity each kit supports. Library of Things kits are available to Benbrook Public Library cardholders ages 18 and up and are limited to one per borrower.

EARLY LITERACY KITS

Our early literacy kits for children include themed combinations of books, toys, games, and other manipulatives to encourage a love of reading.

MEDIA

OVER 6,000 DVDS FOR ALL AGES

We have a wide selection of popular movies, TV shows, documentaries, and educational videos on DVD and Blu-ray. Cardholders are welcome to check out up to ten videos at a time.

Our Binge Boxes give you a themed collection of multiple movies all at once for when you'd like to have a marathon movie watching session.

Don't forget our Great Courses, which feature lessons on a variety of subjects taught by renowned professors.

WANT MORE?

Benbrook resident and nonresident cardholders may request that items owned by our partner MetroShare libraries be sent to our library for convenient pick up. Other MetroShare libraries' items may be returned to Benbrook.

Interlibrary loan service allows Benbrook cardholders to borrow items from libraries throughout the country.

Resident cardholders may also get a Texshare card, which grants borrowing privileges from many public and academic libraries throughout Texas.



CloudLibrary offers a collection of over 170,000 ebooks and audiobooks to enjoy. You can checkout 3 items at a time, and each item can be borrowed for up to 14 days.

- In cloudLibrary, choose your state and library.

 Create an account using your Benbrook library card number (on the back of your library card) and the pin associated with your library card. Your pin will be the last four digits of your library card number unless you customized it.
- Browse the collection of ebooks and audiobooks.
- When you find an item you want, click on the title and then click "Borrow."
- Borrowed titles appear under "My Books" in the app. You can stream your items or download them to your device to enjoy them offline.

hoopla

With hoopla, you can borrow movies, music, ebooks, audiobooks, and comics. Titles can be borrowed immediately, and the length of time an item can be borrowed depends on the item type. You may borrow 10 items per month with hoopla.

- Stream or download the item to view/listen to it.

Laser Engraving

We have a Zing 50 Watt laser engraving machine by Epilog. The bed size is 24"x12" and will cut 1/8" wood or acrylic. We also have a rotator that will allow you to print on cylindrical cups.

Materials available are wood @ \$.05/sq.in and acrylic @ \$.10/sq.in plus tax. Free if you bring your own material.

3D Printing

We have three (3) Polyprinter 229 model 3D Printers available for use. We primarily use ABS plastic and Ninja flex. Cost is calculated at \$.10 gram plus tax. For ideas: www.thingiverse.com

Cricut

We have the Maker model Cricut that will cut most material including vinyl, cardstock, leather, pleather, and numerous other materials. We also have a good selection of pens to draw as well. Our supplies are at cost if used plus tax.


Poster Printer
